1. Mission, Responsibility, and Components of the Model. List the three components of the Nebraska Standardized Model in the space below.
2. Mission, Responsibility, and Components of the Model. Of the three components of the Nebraska Standardized Model that you listed in Question #1 above, which one(s) are the responsibility of the justice system and which one(s) are the responsibility of the substance abuse system?
